SUBJECT: Use of General Services Administration (GSA) Contracts for Air Passenger Transportation Services (GSA Airline City Pair Program) for Attendance at Inactive Duty Training (IDT) Assemblies

1. **PURPOSE.** In accordance with the authority in DoD Directive (DoDD) 5124.02 (Reference (a)), this instruction reissues DoD Instruction (DoDI) 4515.16 (Reference (b)) to establish policy, assign responsibilities, and update the requirements, conditions, and restrictions for use of GSA Airline City Pair Program for attendance at IDT assemblies.

2. **APPLICABILITY.** This instruction applies to OSD, the Military Departments (including the Coast Guard at all times, including when it is a Service in the Department of Homeland Security by agreement with that Department), the Office of the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Joint Staff, the Combatant Commands, the Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Defense, the Defense Agencies, the DoD Field Activities, and all other organizational entities within the DoD (referred to collectively in this instruction as the “DoD Components”).

3. **POLICY.** It is DoD policy that:

a. Reserve Component Service members of a Military Department and the U. S. Coast Guard (USCG) will be afforded the opportunity to use the GSA Airline City Pair Program for travel to attend IDT in accordance with section 12603 of Title 10, United States Code (U.S.C.) (Reference (c)).

b. The Secretary concerned may reimburse qualified Selected Reserve Service members for GSA Airline City Pair Program expenses incurred as a result of travel to attend IDT in accordance with section 452 of Title 37, U.S.C. (Reference (d)).


4. **RESPONSIBILITIES.** See Enclosure 2.

ENCLOSURE 2

RESPONSIBILITIES

1. UNDER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR PERSONNEL AND READINESS (USD(P&R)). The USD(P&R) develops and implements this instruction as required and in accordance with Reference (a).

2. ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR MANPOWER AND RESERVE AFFAIRS (ASD(M&RA)). Under the authority, direction, and control of the USD(P&R), and in accordance with DoDD 5124.10 (Reference (e)), the ASD(M&RA) develops additional procedures as required.

3. SECRETARIES OF THE MILITARY DEPARTMENTS AND THE COMMANDANT OF THE USCG. The Secretaries of the Military Departments and the Commandant of the USCG:
 - a. Publish regulations to determine the normal commuting distance and grant exceptions for non-contiguous States and U.S. territories and possessions requiring off-island or inter-island travel through the Per Diem, Travel, and Transportation Allowance Committee as established in DoDI 5134.31, Volume 5 (Reference (f)).

 - b. Develop and distribute departmental policies and implementing procedures regarding the use of the GSA Airline City Pair Program for attendance at IDT and potential for reimbursement thereof pursuant to paragraph U7160 of Volume 1 of the Joint Federal Travel Regulations (Reference (g)).

 - c. Verify departmental policies and implementing procedures prevent misuse or abuse of the use of the GSA Airline City Pair Program for attendance at IDT pursuant to USD(P&R) Memorandum (Reference (h)).

 - d. Require compliance with Reference (g) and Chapter 3 of Volume 9 of DoD 7000.14-R (Reference (i)).

ENCLOSURE 3

PROCEDURES

Commanders or appropriate supervisors:

a. Designate in writing those Reserve Component Service members in their unit or command who are considered outside reasonable commuting distance from their IDT location to authorize the use of GSA Airline City Pair Program fares.

b. Designate in writing qualified Selected Reserve Service members who will be reimbursed for GSA Airline City Pair Program expenses incurred as a result of travel to attend IDT pursuant to paragraph U7160 of Reference (g).

c. Issue an individually billed account Government Travel Charge Card (GTCC) to eligible Reserve Component Service members who are authorized to use GSA Airline City Pair Program fares to travel to or from IDT in accordance with Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Military Personnel Policy Memorandum (Reference (j)).

d. Designate in writing the dates and location of the IDT for which travel is being arranged, and state that the GTCC is authorized for official travel.

e. Determine disciplinary actions as deemed appropriate for misuse of the GTCC in accordance with Reference (h).
